"Funding Provided to Commonwealth Games NI since 2022

"Sport Northern Ireland has awarded £276,000 of Lottery funding to Commonwealth Games NI for the financial year of April 2024 to March 2025. This is the 2nd year of a planned four-year cycle of funding approved by Sport NI Board. However, due to changes with Commonwealth Games 2026 location and a reduced sports programme in Glasgow, Sport NI is working with CWGNI to review and revise this.

High Performance Sport

"The 2026 Commonwealth Games will be comprised of ten different sports. Glasgow will play host to athletics, swimming, track cycling, weightlifting, lawn bowls, judo, 3x3 basketball, gymnastics, netball, and boxing.

"Six of those sports - athletics, swimming, track cycling, weightlifting, lawn bowls and 3x3 basketball - will also feature para events.

"Table 1 below shows funding to the 11 National Governing Bodies whose sports have been confirmed for Glasgow 2026, including athlete award elements for several of those sports.

"People Development

"Over the past 18 months, Sport NI has been working in partnership with Commonwealth Games NI (CGNI) to identify the People Development requirements for 2026 (and beyond) and will be working closely with sports to implement plans to address these in preparation for the Glasgow Games. This is likely to include appropriate interventions to support and develop Performance Leads and Performance Coaches and increase the capacity of the Sport Science and Sports Medicine workforce.

"Sports Institute

"The Sports Institute focuses on improving sport performance through the provision of science, medicine and programme support to national governing bodies. Institute staff work directly with coaches and athletes to maximise the training gains needed to enhance performance. The current Sport Institute Service Delivery plan ends in December 2024 and a new Service Delivery plan will be developed with sports to identify their needs and provide the necessary support to athletes going forward including those participating in the Glasgow 2026 Commonwealth Games. "Sport NI also works with NICGC in providing anti-doping engagement ahead of the games. As part of the UKAD Clean Games Policy, Anti-doping education is provided to all team members before a Games – both athletes and athlete support personnel."
